



## 2009 NAHASDA Income Limits

If the HUD income limit for a county located within a Native American service area is lower than the United States median, you may use the United States median income limit. The United States median income limit for FY 2009 is \$64,000. Therefore, the adjusted income limit for family size and per cent of median income is as follows:

Family size adjustment: For each person in excess of eight, add 8 percent of the four person base to the eight person limit. For example, the nine person limit for a family at 80% of median income is  $(\$51,200 \times .08) + \$67,600 = \$71,700$ . (Note: all income limits are rounded to the nearest \$50).
